WHAT: Every January, APAP|NYC is where performing arts professionals gather to explore issues critical to the field and present the best and newest of dance, music, theater at APAP's annual membership conference. The 2021 edition will be entirely online.

The all-online conference will deliver the many valuable elements from the inperson annual conference, including quality programming and networking events. Additionally, APAP|NYC+ will offer many opportunities to connect with collaborators and activate the art, through a virtual EXPO Hall, pitch sessions and performance showcases.

WHY: Most importantly, this year's conference is an agenda-setting conference, tightly focused on issues to help the performing arts field navigate the next 12-18 months. Critical, fieldwide conversations will happen daily, focused on topics like public health, anti-racism, the climate crisis. equitable practice, and the reopening and restarting of the performing arts. WHO: Dr. Anthony Fauci will speak on Saturday, Jan. 9, 2021 at 1:00-2:00 p.m. (EST) in a plenary session titled "Public Health and Re-Opening the Live Performing Arts" in conversation with Maurine Knighton of the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation. Called "the face of America's fight against Coronavirus" (BBC), Anthony S. Fauci, M.D. is director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) at the U.S. National Institutes of Health, where he oversees an extensive research portfolio focused on infectious and immunemediated diseases. Dr. Fauci was recently named chief medical advisor to the incoming Biden administration.

APAP|NYC+ 2021 will be the first conference under the leadership of APAP's new President and CEO Lisa Richards Toney who joined APAP in July 2020. Toney brings more than 20 years of experience to APAP having held leadership positions at the DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities, the Pen/Faulkner Foundation, The American Place Theatre, and the Debbie Allen Dance Academy.
